Fellowships are monetary awards for study, travel, or research for students who have completed their undergraduate education. You can research other fellowships by googling or by looking at websites particular to your field of study. Fellowships are competitive and usually require a formal application process.

#### **Red Sox Fellowship Boston, MA Deadline: 1/4/08**

The Boston Red Sox are seeking college graduates and/or recipients of advanced degrees for the second year of the Red Sox Fellowship Program.
